**PROGRAM:** Joe Perdicho, proud member of the management staff at Unistel, gave the group a tour of the spice packaging center. Three sections handle manual, semi-automated and fully automated operations, as required by the spices being packaged. It was near the end of their 6 hour operations day so that clean up was already underway in some areas. Very high standards of cleanliness are maintained in the operation whose production is geared largely to military and industrial clients. A test of potential in the retail arena is to start soon with product test sales at Eastview Mall. Look for it! Joe explained that the operation is run as if it were a for-profit business. In some cases, placement in a regular commercial business can come from experience here. This is a big business; sales of Unistel in 2012 could come close to \$30 million. As a specialized operation, they can produce certain items very efficiently, offering out-sourcing opportunities to other operations. A win-win for all, especially for the many developmentally challenged people who work there.

Because of the uniqueness of the meeting and its locale, there was no 50/50 raffle nor were happy dollars collected. (We can make up for that next week.)
