- Gave a financial report on Camp Haccamo to illustrate why the camp needs to raise funds to replace the \$200,000 lost from the LPGA.
- For income, the camp receives \$50.00 per member from all 17 clubs in the area that are responsible for the camp which totals about \$26,000 each year. United Way contributes \$10,000, RCSN contributes \$20,000 for a total of \$76,500.
- For expenses, the spends \$91,500 on rent to The Sunshine Campus, \$106,000 on staff, \$56,000 on other for a total of \$253,750.
- This leaves a gap to be made up of \$177,250 from The Hike for Haccamo and other fund raisers.

PROGRAM

Today's program was the District Governor NORMA MADAYAG-REILLY and introduced by HERB GAUCH, the Area 10 Assistant District Governor who will be retiring from this post after this year.

Norma joined Newark Rotary in 1998, was an Ambassadorial Scholar in 1979-1983, is a graduate of Syracuse University, was President of Newark Rotary in 2005-2006 and Assistant District Governor. She is a bequest Society member, Sustaining Foundation member, Paul Harris Fellow, Benefactor and has served on many club and district committees.

DG Norma declared we are a "Healthy District". We are her 44th club visit this year. She wants to spread the word of RI President Kalyan Banerjee's theme of "Reach within to embrace humanity". Each Rotarian is valued for their efforts, interests and aspirations to provide service. There are three areas to be considered Family – Continuity – Change. Family is important (Ours and others) and having fellowship within the club and having fun. Make a difference in lives. Continuity is important to preserve current projects that are viable. Change, so we are the instruments of change.

The Rotary Foundation is Rotary's Life Blood and deserves the support of all Rotarians. Currently we are looking for a Rotarian team leader to accompany four GSE team members to the Philippines in February and March next year. The format of the Group Study Exchange will be changing next year.

The District Conference is going to be in Rochester next year at the Hyatt Regency May 18-20. This should make it easy for all Rotarians to experience a District Conference.
