An offshoot of this is Rotary's new Peace and Conflict Resolution which started in 1996. This year's team will go to Latvia and Sweden April 12 through May 2, 2013. Starting next year there will be a somewhat different emphasis. The GSE team will be made up of people all of whom are from the same vocation.
