**PROGRAM** – ZAC DRESSNER introduced Don Ducharme. Don teaches public speaking at Zac's private school and volunteers for the chaplain's program at the prison. Don is a member of the Toastmasters Club of Webster. **Toastmasters** is an organization that focuses on speech-making and leadership development. Also attending from the club were Jim Runyon and Tom Sergent.

Jim Runyon is one of the newer members of the club. He gave a prepared speech titled "Don't Procrastinate", about dealing with problems ("bugs" as he called them). Jim was a math professor at RIT for 38 years and now works at Baywinde teaching Bible study.

Tom Sergent is a retired Kodak worker and current adjunct professor at Empire State College. He is also a member of the Penfield Players and has achieved the highest level at Toastmasters. He gave a speech comparing Rotary to Toastmasters. He liked Rotary's Four Way Test, but felt that Toastmasters would have to add a 5<sup>th</sup> test: "Will there be food?"

Toastmasters was founded in 1934 by Ralph Smedley. They began allowing female members in 1973, which has been a great addition to the club as approximately 75% of their members in Webster are now female. Prominent local Toastmasters include Maggie Brooks and Ursula Burns.
