PROGRAM

Today's program was a discussion on the pros and cons of Sunday's Euchre Tournament fund raiser.

Euchre Tournament Co-Chairs, P-E CHRISTIAN PAPPAS and CHRIS KAUSCH, thanked all the members who helped put on the event. Especially noted were BILL PETHICK for his organization of the event, JACK BEST for all the prizes he solicited, JACK WETZEL for organizing all the prizes, CHARLIE BELLOMO for keeping the event on track timing-wise and general coordination of the games themselves, MARIE CINTI for the signs and CHRIS KAUSCH for his help in the handling of the finances.

The wine sold out and we tapped some of the prize WINES to make up the difference. Not as many people bought beer which was a surprise.

We had 56 paid players, a disappointing number as we were prepared for up to 150.

Virtually all comments from the players were positive. Several people liked the atmosphere of the tournament and they liked the 8 games. There were a few comments about the late start but otherwise the game timing was good. Additional comments will be received from members and players and be brought to the table on a rap-up meeting to be held soon.

One glitch was that the PA system was not adequate for the people in the back of the room. That was corrected by moving the PA system to the center of the room.

The system for awarding the Pick-A-Prize needs to tighten up by recording the winning numbers rather than the names and matching the Pick-A-Prizes with the corresponding winning number. This could be done by stopping sales between games 7 and 8.

Temporary financial report was presented by Chris Kausch: Food and drink sales were \$242.00, 50/50 raffle was \$176.00, Pick-A-Prize was \$286.00. Gross income was \$2,343.00 minus expenses of \$656.00 for a net of \$1,687.00.

NELS CARMAN notes that when the spending during the tournament is \$4.00 per person or more that's good. It is not good when spending is less than \$4.00 per person. It appears this year it was over \$12.00.

Reviewing the attendance of past recent games, it appears that there is no particular advantage to the Spring or Fall attendance. Sunday's weather was so nice some may have preferred to stay home and rake leaves, believe it or not.
