**PROGRAM:** Harb Purewal is a member of the Gurdwara of Rochester, located on Dublin Road in Penfield. Mr. Purewal is a mechanical engineer for Xerox. He, along with a number of other Sikh families, migrated to Rochester in the 1960's and 70's and founded the Gurdwara of Rochester. They built their current building on Dublin Road in 1986.

Sikhism is a relatively new religion that was founded approximately 500 years ago in the Punjab region of India by Guru Nanak. The central teaching of the religion is equality. There were ten living Gurus, and now the holy book (Guru Granth Sahib Ji) is considered the 11<sup>th</sup> and final Guru. The word Sikh means "pupil", and the word Gurdwara means "door to God". There are approximately 26 million Sikhs worldwide, with 20 million in India and 1 million in the United States.

The Gurdwara of Rochester holds weekly religious services on Sundays at 11:00, featuring scripture, songs, prayers, and a communal meal. Attendees of the service sit on the floor to represent equality (although accommodations are made for those who cannot sit on the floor). Anyone from the community is welcome to attend.
